Correct answer: have never been

- We use the present perfect to talk about past experiences when we don't say or we don't know when something happened.
- ▶ We often use the words **never**, **ever**, or **before** to talk about experiences.
- To review the present perfect, go to B1 » Grammar points » Past simple or present perfect?
- 2 Why are you driving ✓ so fast? Please, slow down!
 - ▶ We use the present continuous for actions in progress now or 'around now'.
 - To review the present continuous, go to B1 » Grammar points » Present simple or present continuous
- 3 A: I'm late for my flight! B: Don't worry. I ugoing to drive ≥ you to the airport.

Correct answer: 'Il drive

- We use **will** to express **instant decisions** (decisions that we make at the moment of speaking).
- ► To review future forms, go to B1 » Grammar points » Future forms will, be going to, present continuous
- **4** We have lived ✓ in this house since we got married.



about situations that started in the past and have not finished.

- To review the present perfect simple, go to B1 » Grammar points » Past simple or present perfect?
- **5** A: When have you arrived **>** ? B: Last night.

Correct answer: did you arrive

- We use the **past simple** (NOT present perfect) when we say or ask **when** something happened.
- To review this grammar topic, go to B1 » Grammar points » Past simple or present perfect?
- 6 When I met John, he was going through difficult times.
- We use the past continuous for **actions in progress** in the past or longer actions interrupted by shorter actions in past simple.
- To review past tenses, go to B1 » Grammar points » Past simple, past continuous, past perfect
- 7 It was cold, but I didn't have my coat because I gave × it to my nephew.

Correct answer: had given


- We use the past perfect simple to talk about single actions completed earlier in the past.
- To review ____, go to B1 » Grammar points » Past simple, past continuous,



- 8 Are you going to ✓ watch the game tonight?
- We use be going to to talk or ask about someone's plans and intentions (decisions that have been made at the time of speaking).
- To review be going to, go to B1 » Grammar points » Future forms will, be going to, present continuous
- 9 What do you do ✓ on Thursdays after class?
- We use **present simple** to talk about **habits**; for actions that we do (o we don't do) regularly.
- To review the present simple, go to B1 » Grammar points » Present simple or present continuous
- **10 Will you pass** ✓ me the book, please?
 - We use **will** for offers and **requests** (when we ask someone to do something).
 - ► To review future forms, go to B1 » Grammar points » Future forms will, be going to, present continuous
